Vision


Our vision is to support healthy and thriving communities and care systems in western North Carolina.

Online scorecards share real-time information with community members, partners, leaders, and funders about how they are improving the health of their communities.

Included in the core support provided via WNC Healthy Impact for Community Health Assessment:

- Collect, manage, and report western North Carolina secondary dataset
- Collect & report regional community health survey data (via the centralized regional process)
- Conduct & report county-specific key informant interviews
- Make county-specific 211 resource inventories available
- Make a selection of county-specific maps available
- Provide Community Health Assessment (CHA) & State of the County Health Report (SOTCH) templates (paper and Scorecard)
- Conduct regional trainings
- Provide tailored training, coaching, and support for local process leaders
- Support partnership and dialogue between hospitals and public health agencies
- Provide training and coaching to infuse Results-Based Accountability into community health improvement planning

Fee-for-service extras that WNC Health Network can provide to support local capacity around CHA/CHIP:

- Support collection, management, analysis, and reporting of additional local data (not included in the WNC Healthy Impact regional primary and secondary dataset)
- Plan, prepare, facilitate and report findings from focus groups/listening sessions
- Present community health data to local partners
- Provide evaluation planning and support
- Facilitate local health issue prioritization
- Facilitate cross-sector community strategic planning
- Write Community Health Assessment
